# Statewide Initiatives for Transfer

- Political pressures
    - Baby Boom Echo
    - No “room at the inn?”
  - Statewide “Capacity” group:
    - USM and Community College collaboration
    - Began with the data – developing a shared knowledge of what is happening
  - Partnerships to build “Best Practices”
    - Maryland partnered with Montgomery College, Prince George’s CC and College of Southern Maryland

# A Snapshot of the University of Maryland



- 25,857 Undergraduates, fall 2007
  - 30% began as transfers from other institutions
  - Majority (92% total, 82% of transfers) are full-time
  - Over 130 majors in 11 colleges
- 10,157 Graduate Students
- 6,166 Bachelor's Degrees, FY 2007
  - 30% of recipients began as transfers

# Initial Steps at Maryland

- 
- Created a Transfer Committee, fall 2004
  - Apologized to community college vice presidents
  - Formed UM-CC committees and got to work

# The Toughest Challenges in Crossing the 2-year/4-year Culture Divide

Ignorance on both sides of each other's institutions


- 4-year snobbishness and indifference
- 4-year aggression: we want your students
- 4-year insistence: our courses and faculty are better than yours
- 2-year snobbishness, anger, defensiveness
- 2-year fear: you will take our students too soon
- 2-year insistence: our courses and faculty are better than yours

  - Admissions, enrollment, retention/ graduation, and Jr. course

# The Technology Behind the Solution

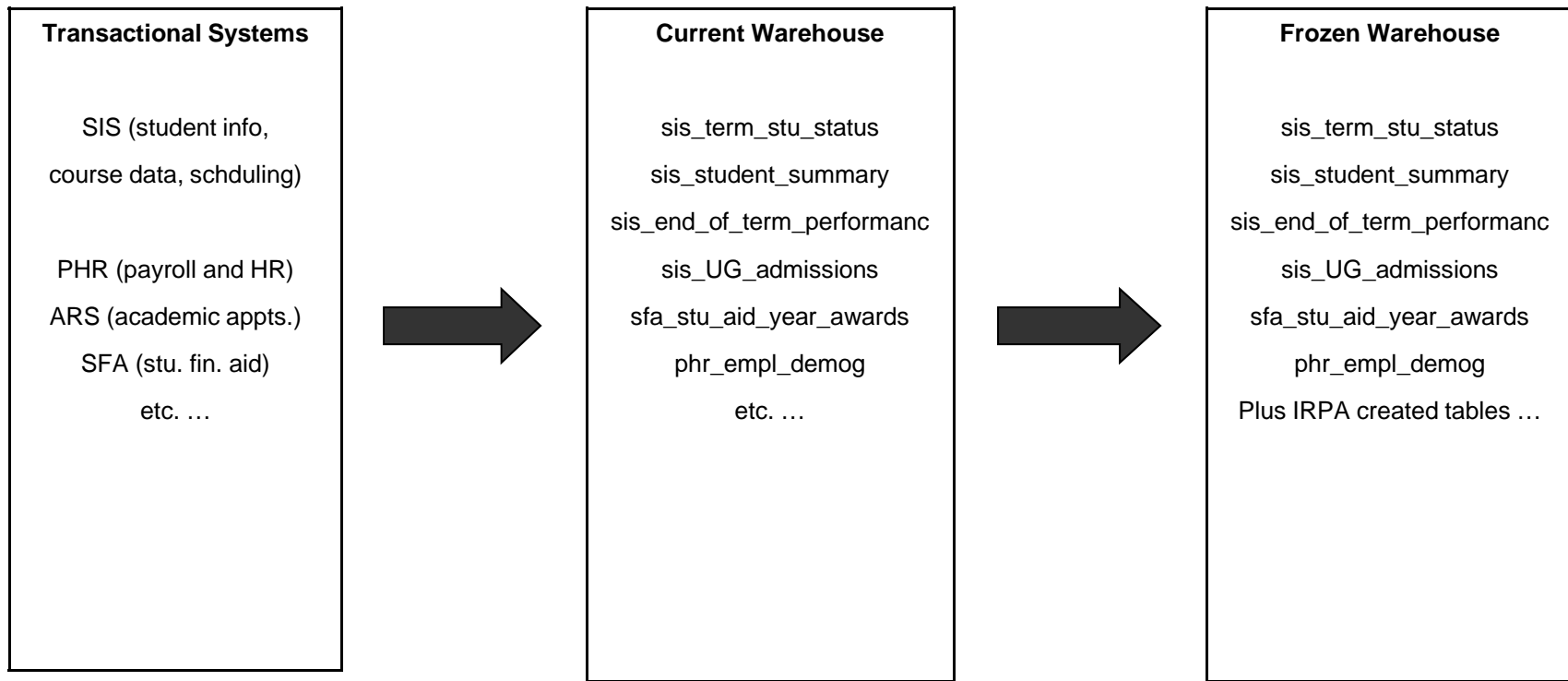
- 
- ColdFusion with Apache on one Solaris server
  - Oracle on a different Solaris server
  - Authentication is done using the campus LDAP server
    - So we don't have to keep track of usernames and passwords

- The data on the web site comes from the UMCP data warehouse.
  - The warehouse is built and maintained by the Office of Data Administration.

# Security and Collaboration

- 
- Secure site – limited access
  - Intended to provide data which begins a dialog
  - Provides consistent set of data for persons at CC and UM to use in designing research, assessment or new initiatives

# Profiles Limitations and Caveats

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- Uses standard definition of transfer, does not differentiate by credit level
- Identifies student by the last institution they attended
- May not match other data sources which track enrollment only
  - National Student Clearinghouse
  - MHEC EIS matches

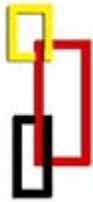
